Noting that armed forces of France and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland are conducting military operations against Egyptian territory, and that the United Kingdom has interrupted to the serious prejudice of many nations, the present resolution.

Expressing its grave concern over these developments, and its conviction that all parties now in the area agree to an immediate cessation of hostilities, and to the necessary steps to be taken to re-open the Suez Canal and to secure freedom of navigation;

3. Recommends that all Member States refrain from introducing military goods in the area of hostilities, or prevent the implementation of the present resolution.

4. Urges that, upon the cease-fire being effective, steps be taken to re-open the Suez Canal and to secure freedom of navigation;
