

should be pursued in order to put an end to this serious situation. It is requested that all concerned take such steps as may be necessary to bring about a just and lasting peace in the Union of Burma by means of their disarmament and interment;

5. Urges all States:

- (a) To afford the Government of the Union of Burma the assistance in their power to facilitate by peaceful means the evacuation of these forces from Burma; and

6. Invites the Government of the Union of Burma to report on the situation to the General Assembly at its eighth session.
