CHAPTER I. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

(f) The "authorities of a Participating State" are those authorities who are empowered by the law of that State to enforce its military or other members of its armed forces in a State in which the Force operates. An "Host State" is the Government of a Host State.

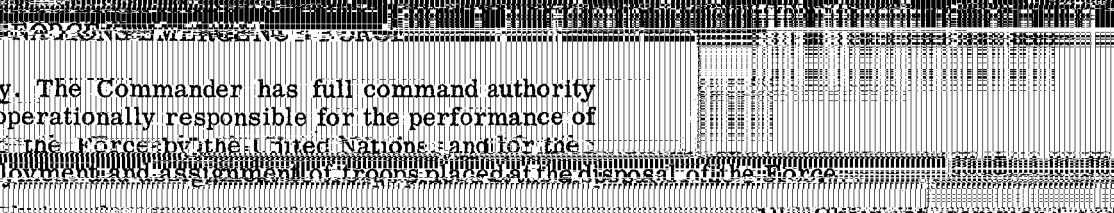

Commander: The Commander shall have direct authority for the operation of the Force and for arrangements for the provision of facilities, supplies and auxiliary services. In the exercise of this authority he shall act in consultation with the Secretary-General in accordance with the administrative and financial principles con-

Members in the performance of their duties for the Force the

Commander and the chain of command designated by him.

Members of the Force shall receive their instructions only through the Commander and the chain of command designated by him. Members of the Force shall not communicate to any person in any position with them the course of their duties or the instructions of this Force.

32. Discretion and non-communication of information. Members of the Force shall exercise the utmost discretion in regard to all matters relating to their duties and functions. They shall not communicate to any person any information known to them by reason of their position in the Force which has not been made public, except in the course of their duties or by authorization of the Commander. The obligation of discretion shall extend to members of the Force after their discharge from the Force.

Members of the Force shall not accept any gift or remuneration as a member of the Force.

Members of the Force shall not accept any gift or remuneration from external sources. No member of the Force may accept any honour, decoration, favour, or distinction incompatible with the individual status and functions of a member of the Force.

34. Jurisdiction.

(a) Members of the Force shall be subject to the criminal jurisdiction of their respective national States in accordance with the laws and regulations of those States. They shall not be subject to the criminal jurisdiction of the courts of the Host State. Responsibility for the exercise of criminal jurisdiction shall be determined as appropriate in the case of contingents.

(b) Members of the Force shall not be subject to the civil jurisdiction of the Host State in respect of matters relating to their official duties.

(c) Members of the Force shall remain subject to the military rules and regulations of their respective national States without derogating from their responsibilities as members of the Force as defined in these Regulations and any rules made pursuant thereto.

(d) Disputes involving the Force and its members shall be settled in accordance with such procedures provided by the Secretary-General as may be required, including the establishment of a claims commission. Supplemental instructions defining the jurisdiction of such commissions. Supplemental procedures as may be established shall be issued by the Secretary-General in accordance with article 3 of these Regulations.
