The Secretary-General of the United Nations communicates the following:

On 30 June 1999, Chile deposited with the Secretary-General, in accordance with article 16(2), 75(2) and 84(2) of the Convention, the following chart:

**Chart No. 1 annexed to the Treaty of Peace and Friendship concluded between Argentina and Chile on 29 November 1984, with list of geographical coordinates of points**

In this connection, due note should be taken that in its final verbatim of transmission, the Permanent Mission of Chile to the United Nations recalled that article 3 of the Treaty of Peace and Friendship provides that:

“The Parties agree that in the area included between Cape Horn and the easternmost point of “Isla de los Estados”, the legal effects of the territorial sea shall be limited, in their mutual relations, to a strip of three marine miles measured from their respective base lines.

In the area indicated in the preceding paragraph, each Party may invoke with regard to third States the maximum width of the territorial sea permitted by international law.
