It is clear that common objectives, a common vision, and complementarity between the new BBNI Agreement, Regional Fisheries Management Organizations and other regional bodies are essential for effective implementation of both CIIIS and the new Agreement.

I also invite your attention to the fact that all news harklistings adopted at CIIIS CP19 in Parama in 2022 have now entered into force (the last ones on 25 November 2023) and, as a result, several hundreds of shark and any species, among others, are now listed in CIIIS Appendices.
