Regional workshops to facilitate the description of ecologically or biologically significant marine areas (EBSAs)

Since 2011, the CED Secretariat has been coordinating and process of regional workshops to facilitate the discription of areas meeting the scientific oriteria for ecologically or biologically significant matine areas (EBSAs). A total of 321 areas discribed as meeting the EBSA criteria during these regional workshops have already been considered by COP, included in the CBD EBSA repository and submitted to the United Nations General Assembly and other relevant processes. The outputs of the regional EBSA workshops, as considered by COP, areas all able online at the EBSA vebsite (http://www.cbdint/ebsa).
