#### Mandate of UNOCT

#### **UNOCT** has five main functions:

- 1. Enhance coordination and coherence across the 38 CTITF entities to ensure balanced implementation of the four pillars of the Strategy;
- 2. Provide leadership on the General Assembly counter-terrorism mandates entrusted to the SG from across the UN system;
- 3. Strengthen the delivery of UN counter-terrorism capacity-building assistance to Member States
- 4. Improve visibility advocacy, and resource mobilization for UN counterterrorism efforts; and
- 5. Ensure that due priority is given to counter-terrorism across the UN system and that the important work on PVE is firmly rooted in the strategy


Developed a Communication & Visibility Strategy


