The \$ro3e%t obtained a very satisfa%tory level of

youth asso%iations# The e&tent to whi%h this im\$a%t %an be %onsolidated will de\$end on the degree of ownershi\$ a%hieved by the young \$eo\$le but will also de\$end on e&ternal fa%tors, su%h as the ado\$tion of the im\$lementation budget for the !!J, whi%h has still not been %onfirmed by the Muni%i\$ality#





-n s\$ite of all this, it is %lear that this result a%hieved a highly \$ositive level of effe%tiveness, both in terms of em\$owering young \$eo\$le and in terms of their motivation and desire to %ontinue with the %ommitment they have made#

(everhteless, the \$ro3e%t %ould have worked more on an o\$erative level, on how to a\$\$ly the %ontent whi%h was worked on during the training sessions# -n addition to being motivated to >re\$eatA the lessons a%1uired, it would have been im\$ortant for the young \$eo\$le to be able to use tham at a more \$ra%ti%al level and find answers for transforming their %ommunities and %olle%tively solving \$roblems that affe%t them# Carrying out follow@ u\$ visits and lo%al a%%om\$anying measures in the %ommunities would have made it \$ossible to im\$rove the owernshi\$ of the transformative dimension of the %iti"enshi\$ e&er%ise#





The youth asso%iations whi%h have been %reated are o\$erational and have been able to formulate their a%tion \$lans# However, they need to be %onsolidated and need to strengthen their o\$erational %a\$a%ity in order to ensure %ontinuity and to in%rease their %a\$a%ity for dialog and for linking with the Muni%i\$al Bouth Offi%e and with lo%al \$oliti%al \$owers# They also need to strengthen the management %a\$a%ity of their e&e%utive bodies in order to gain a%ess to \$ubli% funding and ensure their autonomy# Raising awareness among and em\$owering lo%al authorities on the issue of youth \$arti%i\$atory rights in \$ubli% administration is a favourable element whi%h %an %ontribute to ensuring effe%tive and sustainable s\$a%es for dialog and \$oliti%al involvement, es\$e%ially through the OMJ and the im\$lementation of the !! J#

The %urrent \$oliti%al %onte&t following the ele%tion of the new mayor will allow to anti%i\$ate %ontinuity and to %a\$itali"e on the a%hievements whi%h were gained throughout the \$ro3e%t# The issues whi%h were raised by the young \$eo\$le and \$la%ed on the \$oliti%al agenda, su%h as unem\$loyment, a%ess to edu%ation, se&ual and re\$rodu%tive health, and the fight against violen%e should be taken u\$ again and should be su\$\$orted by the new muni%i\$al administration#

The muni%i\$al mayor@ele%t has re1uested that COMAD! su\$\$ort the OMJ in the im\$lementation of the !ubli%!oli%y on Bouth for one year# -n the interview that was %ondu%ted, the new mayor e&\$ressed his %lear will to %ontinue su\$\$orting the OMJ and to \$romote youth \$arti%i\$ation in the muni%i\$ality# He also e&\$ressed the desire to broaden the training o\$\$ortunities to other villages in the muni%i\$ality, stating that the \$ro3e%t did good work in ;< %ommunities but that it was ne%essary to rea%h the :P; villages of the muni%i\$ality of 2aya&%h0#




