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TENTH COORDINATION MEETING ON

The United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime developed series of training materials for the range of expertise from front-line border order officers to high-level policy-makers. a. Anti-Human Trafficking in Persons Training Manual and Basic and In Depth Training Modules against the Smuggling of Migrants

Both Manual and Modules discuss measures of effective law enforcement under the Trafficking in Persons and Smuggling of Migrants Protocol. The First Aid has been designed in response to the need identified by many practitioners in different regions of the world to easily accessible information for law enforcement officers, to increase the identification of trafficked persons.

c. Human Trafficking Case Law Database

The database reporting system for collecting and disseminating information on human trafficking prosecutions and convictions includes judges, prosecutors, police officers, academics, researchers and other interested parties to the decisions regarding these issues. It is a national, or provincial level for interpretation and application of these issues, to consist of practices and different standards, and to identify the role of human trafficking crimes. The system is designed to identify people affected by human trafficking, to help police and other agencies.
