Therefor I urge you all todayo turn these recommendations from ink on papactionable points You will find a copy on that table. But let me quickly highlight some of these recommendations:

 In light of the tremendous contribution this spora is making to global development; role of Diasporashas to be recognised in add the post-2015 development objectives ery concretely, government hould allocate a certain percentage of evelopment aid to diasporaorganisations development work.

- 2. States and intergovernmental bodies should praner with the diaspora in decision making processes, planning implementation and monitoring of development policies Concretely they should assign an easily accessible focal point in these regards.
- 3. The misalignment of education systems to thilabour market needs of a mobile worldnas to be addressed. And this means to replip mote regional mobility and integrion as well as equal access to labor market and social inclusion.
- 4. National and international ws and migration policies that put women at riskneed to be hanged And therole that migrant women play in peace-buildingand conflict resolution needs to be strengthened.
- 5. It is crucial, Establish platforms for and by the diaspora We, ADYNE, know from experienced that creating a platform is what made our voice in the local ones.
- 6. Professional common spaces should be Organis# that bring together the aspora, the private sector, the development agencies and the NG oscountries of originand destination for knowledge sharing.
- 7. Migrant entrepreneurs women and men alike should be empowered as drivers for economic and social development.
- 8. Capacity building has to be provided tograss root diaspora organisations.
- 9. Coming back to the importance of giving the migrantsoice, voting rightseed to be provided to migrants at local level and upwards.

Those recommendations have been formulated also young leaders of the diaspora and often, when we talk about the Diaspora, we fail too genize that over 60% of those are YOUTH.

The United Nations Secretary-GenleBan Ki-moon himself leads be ample by appointing an Envoy on Youth Ahmad Alhindawi.

So let us RECOGNISE the major role that Diaspora YELLA play to spearhead daact as a catalyst in every issue affecting the Diaspora. Let's give the the bring forth some REAL and TANGIBLE change.

To prompt these changes, ADYNE will soon be lating a campaign called Intertional Day of African Diaspora, in short IOAD, aiming to transform the irea of the African Diaspora (D) living in Europe and creating dialogue with policy makers.

Next to all the discussion we will be having today and the recommendation we will be taking forward to the HLD, I invite you all, on behalf of the Diasportsmake the YOUTH an instrumental element of every discussion that is held, every policy that is the drand every project that is to be implemented.
