



1. The number of international migrants worldwide has increased


... however since 2000, Asia added more international migrants than any other region





... however patterns are changing


Migrant stock originating within the same region, 1990 and 2013 (percentage)

4. Migration is an important component of population change in some regions


Total population, Medium variant vs. Zero net migration, 1990-2050 (billions)
