

15th Coordination Meeting on International Migration

- 2% The inclusion, communication and mobilization of all stakeholders, including constituencies at the local, national, regional and global levels is essential. The engagement and incorporation of the views of migrants themselves is particularly important.
- 3% The compact should strive to focus on practical solutions, learning from prior experience of intergovernmental agreements, including the success factors of the 4CPD Programme of Action and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.
- 5% The proposed international deliberations must be based on accurate data and evidence to inform the development of the global compact and to carry forward the global campaign to combat xenophobia, intolerance and discrimination.
- 6% All the organizations represented in this meeting have a collective responsibility to live up to the call by the Secretary-General and of Member States to work together towards a successful compact on migration.

In her Secretary-General's address, you will be very pleased to learn that the meeting heeded his call to share information and proposals emanating from your past work and plans for further substantive contributions to the development of the global compact on migration. We have taken good note of all these, and request that you please keep us informed about updates.

In closing, let me warmly thank all participants, including representatives, speakers and moderators for their insightful interventions, and to those who provide detailed written inputs. We were also very grateful to the German mission, which hosted this year's reception.

Lastly but not least, many thanks to my colleagues of the +0'ulation, Mission who did a superb job, working hard and efficiently to organize this meeting, and to carry it through to a successful conclusion, as well as to the assistants, technicians and others who supported this meeting.
