1. We, the Heads of State and Government and High Representatives meeting at the United Nations Headquarters in New York from 25 to 27 September 2015 as the Organization celebrates its seventieth anniversary (as decided today on the global Sustainable Development Goals).
2. On behalf of the peoples of the world (as adopted in a historic decision on a comprehensive, people-centred set of priorities and transformative

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Sustainable Development Goals and targets

57. Concluding an inclusive, process-oriented intergovernmental negotiations/ and based on the proposal of the Open Working Group on Sustainable Development Goals¹⁵ which includes a category containing the latter/ set out below are the Goals and targets which have been agreed.

58. The Sustainable Development Goals and targets are integrated and indivisible/ global in nature and universal/ taking into account different national realities/ capacities and levels of development and respecting national policies and priorities. Targets are defined as aspirational and global/ which each Government setting its own national targets guided by the global level of ambition but taking into account national circumstances. Each Government will also decide on these aspirational and global targets should be incorporated into national planning

1.1 By 2030, eradicate extreme poverty (currently less than \$1.25 a day)

1.2 By 2030, reduce at least by half the number of people living in poverty in all its dimensions according to national definitions
