Nuclear disarmament continues to be a global prioxity significant progress in nuclear disarmament is urgently needely latta we comes the progress maintenance the pursuit of nuclear disarmament and the considerable reductions are enals registered by Nuclear Weapon States in accordance with Article VI of the NP. To this context we welcome the signature of the New Strategic Arms Reduction Treaty (START) by t United States of America and the Russian Federation. Malta commends these countries for their actions and strongly encourages them to seek furthearts in their nuclear arsets, including strategic, non strategic, deployed and nother ployed weapons

The risk of nuclear proliferation continues nonetheless to threaten international peace and security. The challenges before us are unprecedented, both in terms of their nature and scope. The technology transfer requited for the development of nuclear approach has become easier, facilitating access to weapons of mass destruction by individuals or terrorist groups.

The proliferation of nuclear weapons and other weapons of mass destruction (WMD), and their delivery systems, could have immeasurable diresequences with an impact not just on international security and stability. The use of nuclear weapons sould have incalculable and devastating on sequences of numan health and on the environment, and the climate, among other areals. is with this in mind that Malta, along with a number of other countries, joined the Austrian Pledge following its participation at the Vienna Conference on Humanitarian Impact of Nuclear Weapons, in December 2012 that firmly believes that it is imperative that nuclear weapons are never used again.

### Madam President,

Non-Proliferation must continue to be addressed through peaceful and diplomatic means. Multilateral efforts shall remain the driving force towards the attainment of this objective. In this context Malta commends the IAEA for its continued work in safeguarding the system and in overseeing the implementation of the NPT. Only for the revitalisation of relevant multilateral disarmament machine by odies, which to date continue to deliver verifittle. The current stalemate in the Conference for Disarmament is a source of collaboration.
