Statement by Turkey On Agenda Item 152: UNFICYP Fifth Committee-2nd Part of the Resumed 74th Session (May 2020)

Agreement (SOFA) or agreeing on another mutually acceptable legal arrangement in order to establish the legal ground for UNFICYP's operations in the north, UNFICYP has refrained from signing such a document as of yet. Moreover, it even avoids holding consultations about its operations within the TRNC territory, including those in Mara /Varosha.

In a similar vein, we expect UNFICYP to contact Turkish Cypriot authorities in order to coordinate in particular its plan to install additional CCTV systems in and around areas that fall under the TRNC jurisdiction and any other work that concerns the Turkish Cypriot side.
