

As announced in our letter circulated 29 April 2024, the fourth informal discussion on the contribution for the Summit of the Future will be held on Thursday, 2 May 2024at the Permanent Mission of Kuwait, 321 E 44th St, New York, NY 10017 from 1.15 -2.45p.m. Please find attached a draft text of the IGN contribution to the Pact for the Future prepared by the IGN Co-Chairs. As mentioned in our letter yesterday, this meeting will provide an opportunity for a first informal discussion and to brainstorm on the proposals put forward by the Co-Chairs.

 - e. the reform should include acceptance of the category of y2ear term nonpermanent members as part o and medium
