interpreted on the basis of its own wording and the surrounding context of the agreement it is found in.

The guideline 5 deals with **Cooperation.** The sub-paragraph a) is drafted as a restatement of an obligation which States already have, in much more specific terms, under number of treaties. Sub-paragraph b) provides that "States should cooperate in further enhancing scientific knowledge relating to the causes and impacts of atmospheric polution and atmospheric degradation. Cooperation could include exchange of information and joint monitoring".

Enhancing scientific knowledge about the cause and impacts of atmospheric polution and degradation is undoubtedly an important task. We believe, however, that the guidance in this respect would be better provided by bodies with strong scientific and technical expertise.

We reserve the right to revert to these guidelines once we see the content of other guidelines dealing with the substantive issues concerning the <u>protection</u> of the atmosphere. This will alow us to understand what the <u>obligation to cooperate</u> would in real terms encompase.
