In this regard, I wish to share with you the topics that the coordinators have agreed to address in this year's Meeting:

The prohibition on the use of force under international law; non-State actors and self-defense defense.

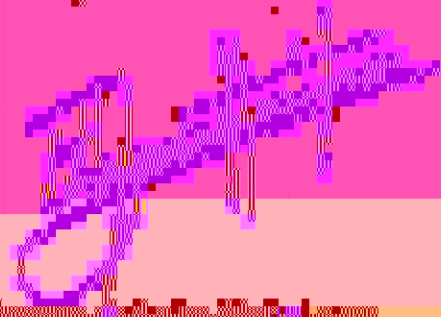
