At the plenary meeting of the 30th Session of the General Assembly in 1975, a resolution was adopted by the unanimous vote of the UN member states, which called for dissolution of the "UN Command" in South Korea and withdrawal of all foreign troops so as to ensure peace and security on the Korean peninsula.
