With respect to proposals regarding new subjectsonsideration for the Special Committeeve continue to welcome new proposals that paraetical, non political, and do not duplicate efforts elsewhere in the United Nationswever, we urge member states to avoid using SpeciaCommittee as a forum for the airing of bilateral concerns, to pursue opics more appropriately raised in other forums.

The United States has welcomed productive stepasityears to streamline the agenda of SpeciaCommittee and to close the discussion of proposals that failed to generateonsensusCommittee members should write give serious consideration to biennial meetings or shortened sessions, especially if the impact of the pandemic continues to create intersteeduling demanant the UN headquarters. We hope the Special Committee will take further steps to improve its efficiency and productivity, and to make best use of scarce Secretariat resources.
