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CANZ recognises the important role diplomatic protection plays as a valuable tool for States to protect rights of their nationals from violations of international law including to provide protection when violations of human rights are committed against their nationals.

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CANZ conside the Draft Articles on Diplomatic Protection to be closely

In the absence of a clear consensus on the elaboration of a convention on the basis of the Articles on State Responsibility, CANZ constituteruld be premature to commence negotiations on a convention to the Draft Articles on Diplomatic Protection.

CANZ considers that certain aspects of the Draft Articles on Diplomatic Protection go beyond our understanding of customary international law relating to diplomatic protectionThere is unlikely to international consensus on whether those aspects should be made the subject of a convention.

To the extent that the Draft Articles articulate important aspects of customary international law, we consider the Draft Articles to provide useful guidance to tates and international bodies and are valuable in their current form.

At the same time, CANZ is also concerned, that there is unlikely to be international consensus as to certain aspects of the current draft articles, engaging in the process of negating a convention at this time risks undermining the influence and value of the draft articles, by opening up debate on the entire set of draft articles.

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We view the Draft Articles as serving a useful purpose in informing and assisting to settle State practice in this important area of law.
