Chair,

1. Ireland has considered with interest the comments of the United Nations on the articles 13 to 15 and the Annex to the draft articles, and will today present a revised version of draft article 13 on capitalisation.
2. Ireland is strongly opposed to the use of the death penalty in all cases and in all circumstances. The final and irreversible nature of this article, and the impropriety of its use as a disciplinary measure, are accordingly, notwithstanding the universal abolition, We support an explicit and progressive definition of capital punishment that applies the death penalty only to those who have committed the most serious crimes and would not be used in the case of the person being extradited.
3. We are grateful for the views expressed by the other delegations on the draft articles 14 and 15 and the Annex, and think that we are now in a position to elaborate the precise content of these provisions in view of the diverse views expressed on the elaboration of a convention. We are confident that, following a period of further discussion, opinion can be resolved through further negotiations and that the procedure can next stage as soon as possible.
