appeals tribunal) allow the appeal time limit in the interest of justice so that Mr. Morris can submit his appeal that has already been finalized.

3. Article 7(3) of the Statute of the Appeals Tribunal provides that the Appeals Tribunal may decide in writing, upon written request by the applicant, to suspend or allow the deadlines (or a limited period of time and only in exceptional cases). Article 7(2) of the Appeals Tribunal Rules of Procedure sets forth the manner in which an appellant should submit a written request (or a waiver of a time limit, and Article 30 of the Rules allows this Tribunal to shorten or extend a time limit when the interests of justice so require).

2. On the basis of Mr. Morris' submissions regarding the circumstances presenting him (in a timely appeal, this Tribunal finds that Mr. Morris has presented an exceptional case and the interests of justice will be served if his request is granted so as to give him an opportunity to present his case.

that Mr. Morris' request is granted, and the appeal (form and appeal brief) shall be filed no later than 17:00 p.m. (Ne) Aor9 time.
