JUDGMENT ON AN APPLICATION FOR SUSPENSION OF ACTION

Introduction

1. On 12 November 2012, the Applicants tastf member of the United Nations Assistance Mission for Iraq ("UNAMI"), worte to the Management Evaluation Unit ("MEU") requesting management evaluation to the decision dated 1 November 2012

UNAMI. According to the 1 November 2012ttler, the purpose of the retrenchment was to reduce UNAMI's budget by ationalizing or abolishing numerous posts in the 2013 budget. The letter also indicated that Applicant's post was one of those that had been earmarked to be abolished ationalized as of 1 January 2013.

6. According to the 26 December 2012 **mag**ement evaluation response from the AUSG/DM ("MEU response"), p

9. After a review of the submissions, tMeEU concluded that the criteria was applied to all staff members in a unifino manner and based on the pre-approved criteria. MEU also concluded that thereswap evidence to suggestat the Applicant had been selected for the retrenchment in an arbitrary or improper manner or that the contested decision was properly motivated.

- 10. In view of the above, MEU concluded at the Administration acted within its discretionary authority in the conduct of the comparative review/retrenchment exercise and that the Applicant had not this burden of proving that the decision terminating his appointment on 31 December 2012 was based on improper motivation, bias or abuse of discretion authority or was non-transparent or otherwise unfair.
- 11. In light of the foregoing, USG/DM infromed the Applicant that the Secretary-General had decided to uphold the decisifterminating" his appointment on 31 December 2012.

Considerations

- 12. Applications for suspension of aconti are governed by art. 2.2 of the Tribunal's Statute and art. 13 ichs Rules of Procedure.
- 13. Article 2.2 of the Statute provides that:

The Dispute Tribunal shall be coeffent to hear and pass judgement on an application filed by annidividual requesting the Dispute Tribunal to suspend, during the endency of the management evaluation, the implementation of contested administrative decision that is the subject of an ongoing anagement evaluation where the decision appears prima facie to belawful, in cases of particular urgency, and where its implementation would cause irreparable damage. The decision of the Dispute Tribunal on such an application shall not be subject to appeal.

14. The three statutory prerestites contained in art. 202f the Statute, namely, prima facie unlawfulness, urgency and irrepareal balamage, must all be satisfied for an application for suspension of action together to note, however, that these prerequisites may only be applied to a decision is the subject of an "ongoing management evaluation".

- 15. In the present case, the Applicant requested management evaluation and suspension of the contested decisions on November 2012. He received a response from the USG/DM to both of his requestin a communication dated 26 December 2012. Subsequently, he filed an application of action with the Tribunal of the same contested decisions.
- 16. Consequently, management evaluation obslonger pending and as such, the Tribunal does not have jurissolion, pursuant to its Statestand Rules of Procedure, over this matter. In view of the foregointon Tribunal will not consider whether or not the statutory prerequisites polima facie unlawfulness, urgrecy and irreparable damage have been satisfied.

Decision

17. In view of the foregoing, the application for suspension of action is hereby rejected.
