**Introduction and Procedural History** 

1. At the time of the application, the Applicant served as a Security Coordination

Officer at the United Nations Mission in Iraq ("UNAMI"). He held a fixed term

appointment at the P-4 level and was based in Kirkuk.

2. On 14 December 2018, the Applicant challenged the Respondent's decision to

separate him from service with compensation in lieu of notice without termination

indemnity in accordance with staff rule 10.2(a)(viii). It is the Applicant's case that the

impugned decision should be rescinded on grounds that the investigation and ensuing

report was flawed. He also moves the court to order his reinstatement with retroactive

payment of his wages and entitlements from 17 September 2017.

3. The Respondent filed his reply to the application on 25 January 2019.

4. The Respondent submits that the impugned decision was based on clear and

convincing evidence that the Applicant's conduct amounted to serious misconduct in

violation of staff regulation 1.2(b), (f) and (q) and staff rules 1.2(c) and (g).

**Considerations and Order** 

5. The Tribunal considers that a case management discussion ("CMD") would

facilitate fair, efficient and expeditious management and disposal of this case.

6. A CMD will take place on Thursday, 30 April 2020 at 4.00 p.m. (Nairobi

Time, UTC +3) using Skype or Microsoft Teams. At the CMD, the Tribunal and the

parties will:

a. Ascertain whether the parties are amenable to considering an alternative

resolution to the dispute;

b. Discuss the claims and issues in the case;

c. Identify the factual and legal issues to be determined;

d. Consider what further information, if any, is required;

e. Identify any documents to be disclosed;

f. Consider if the case may be decided on the basis of the documents, or whether a hearing should be held, and, if there is to be a hearing, to set the dates,

identify the witnesses to be called and the documents to be presented; and

g. Discuss any other matter relevant to these proceedings.

7. As this case management discussion is being held virtually with all parties

appearing from their respective locations, counsel are requested to provide the Registry

with the relevant contact details no later than 24 April 2020.
