15. In Judgment No. UNDT/2020/221, rendered on 31 December 20220, the Dispute Tribunal dismissed two claims but found that the Respondent had abused his authority in mishandling the sexual harassment complaint. The Dispute Tribunal ordered the Respondent to provide the Applicant with a clear explanation for not pursuing her sexual harassment complaint and denied the other remedies sought.

### 16. The Appellant appealed

Tribunal for an award in damages for mishandling her sexual harassment complaint as well as damages for harassment, unfair treatment and abuse of authority, and an immediate promotion to a post at the FS-5 level or *in lieu* compensation.

- 17. On 18 March 2022, the United Nations Appeals Tribunal rendered Judgment No. 2022-UNAT-1212.
- 18. The Appeals Tribunal stated as follows:
