Introduction

1. On 6 November 2023, in response to Order No. 154 (NBI/2023), the parties filed a joint statement of agreed and disagreed facts. By the same filing, the parties also stated their positions regarding holding a hearing on the merits.

2. On 20 November 2023 and on 20 December 2023, the parties filed their responses to Order No. 169 (NBI/2023).

Consideration

3. The Tribunal notes that some of the claims in the case may have been resolved in the various parties' submissions.

4. Consequently, the Tribunal has decided to hold a case management discussion ("CMD"). The purpose of the CMD is to:

a. Discuss and identify the remaining claims and issues in the case;

- b. Discuss any possibility for an amicable resolution of the remaining issues;
- c. Discuss if there is still a need for a hearing; and

d. Generally deal with any other matter relating to the consideration and determination of this application.

Conclusion

- 5. In view of the foregoing IT IS ORDERED THAT:
 - a. A CMD in this case will take place on **Tuesday**, **6** February 2024 at 10 a.m. (Nairobi Time, UTC +3) via Microsoft Teams; and
