Introduction

1. The Applicant, a Legal Officer, Office of Human Resources, Department of filed an application on 6 May 2024 to contest a decision she describes in the following terms:

On 3 November 2023, Ms. Bibi Rabea Damaree, informed me that I would receive USD 9143.52 for education grant advance which excluded certain fees which should have been deemed admissible as enrolment-related.

2. The Respondent filed a reply on 18 June 2024 and requests the Tribunal to reject the application in its entirety. In particular, the Respondent contends that:

the calculation and the payment of an advance pursuant to Section 7 of the ST/AI/2018/1/Rev.1 is not a final decision, including on the admissibility of the expenses. The final amount of the EG for the -2024 is not, at that stage, settled.
