- (# =e affirm that each country has primary responsibility for its own economic and social development, and that the role of national policies, development strategies, and domestic resources is critical\*
- &# =e acknowledge the importance of all sources of development finance, including 8fficial Development Assistance "8DA#, which remains critically important especially for the poorest developing countries that have limited capacity to raise resources, and for key sectors like education, health and other social sectors where need is greatest\*
- ;# =e recognise that domestic resources have been the most rapidly growing component of development financing this decade, and that greater mobilisation of domestic resources is essential to achieving the goals of the \$ost\%' () Development Agenda\*
- 2# =e will apply a holistic approach to domestic revenue mobilisation, encompassing both mobilisation and management of domestic public resources, while respecting national policies and strategies, noting that success depends on both raising domestic revenues, and channeling those resources toward effective public services that enable countries to achieve the goals of the \$ost\%'() Development Agenda\*
