Ambassador Maniratanga, Chair of the UNFF19 Bureau, opened the third meeting of UNFF19 Bureau and welcomed the Bureau members, and the Secretariat. He introduced the provisional agenda for the meeting, which was adopted by the Bureau.

The Vice-Chairs, Ms. Zamora Zumbado (Costa Rica) and Mr. Kubista (Czechia), in their capacity as Vice-Chairs of the Informal Consultation (IC) for UNFF19 (2024) (20.097) and (20.097) Segment declaration, briefed the Bureau on the conduct of virtual informal consultations ahead of UNFF19. They reflected on the positive engagement of delegations as well as the key concerns raised, including calls for the HLS declaration to reflect a higher level of ambition, and references to politically sensitive subjects such as unilateral coercive measures, conflict, and war. The Bureau thoroughly discussed these issues. On inclusion of references to “conflict and war” and “unilateral coercive measures” in the zero draft outcomes of UNFF19, the Bureau stressed its preference to avoid such references, given the mandate and scope of work of UNFF.

The Bureau also reconfirmed using the same modality of the first and second round of informal consultation for the third and final round of informal consultation on 26-27 March 2024. Consistent with the provisions of ECOSOC resolution 2022/17, negotiation of the zero drafts will be as well as

The Bureau carefully examined the implications of these measures and decided on the following modalities for UNFF19, including the HLS, special and side events:

The time limit for statements and interventions during UNFF19 formal meetings, including the HLS will be three minutes. This time limit will be strictly enforced.

Due to time constraints, priority will be given to speakers at the Ministerial/Director-General level and above during the HLS.

Delegations will be invited to express their interest in intervening in the roundtables of the High-Level Segment through the e-Speakers module on the e-deleGATE portal. More information on the opening of the expressions of interest will be communicated later.

For those participating States and entities organizing side events during UNFF19, given the limitation in the provision of technical facilities, should they require additional services beyond automatic self-servicing in the conference rooms, they may consider holding their side events virtually, or, at another venue outside the United Nations Headquarters.

The Bureau agreed that the revised UNFF19 provisional organization of work with a letter from the UNFF19 Chair outlining the modalities for the session be sent to UNFF members and partners by 6 March 2024.

UNFF Secretariat updated the Bureau on logistical arrangements underway for UNFF19, including processing of requests for travel support for participants. An Information Note for UNFF19 Participants was drafted and would be sent to UNFF-NFPs and Permanent Missions soon. This note contains information on registration, accreditation, access to UNHQ, list of hotels, and other logistical matters.

The Bureau also decided to hold a briefing for Permanent Missions in NY at the end of March 2024 on the latest organizational and logistical arrangements for UNFF19.
