These platforms have provided strong political support and recognition to the problem of internal displacement.

Institutional reforms at the AU such as the establishment of regional humanitarian institutions namely the African Humanitarian Agency will provide opportunity to improve implementation of the Kampala Convention, support national and regional coordination, build capacity of Member States and solicit international support. The international community need to provide political, <u>nancial</u> and technical support to these institutional e orts. AU should be encouraged to strengthen the role of regional human rights mechanisms such as the African Commission on Human and Peoples' Rights and the Committee of Experts on the Rights and Welfare of the Child.
