Forced displacement related to disasters, including the adverse e ects of climate change, poses some of the biggest human rights, humanitarian and development challenges facing States and the international community in the 21st century. Each year, millions of people are displaced by disasters caused by natural hazards such as oods, tropical storms, earthquakes, landslides and droughts.
