
How is your country building back better? What are the opportunities, emerging priorities, and best practices to build back better to respond effectively and recover from COVID-19 in SIDS?

Stimulus Package 1

Purpose: To provide immediate relief/support towards the affected individuals and businesses, due to the COVID-19 pandemic

Total Package: \$60 million, allocated by nine (9) clusters:

i. Health, Nutrition, Water, Sanitation, Hygiene (WASH)


