

Firearms trafficking, TOC and terrorism: Identifying the intersections

Procurement of illicit firearms

Perpetrators exploit established networks and connections as well as trafficking channels and modalities, including pre-existing or new links to organized crime groups, to gain access to weapons


Level of violence Firearms increase the destructive power and violence level of organized criminal and terrorist groups

Financing of activities

Organized criminal and terrorist groups increasingly engage in transnational organized criminal activities, including firearms trafficking, to finance their terrorist activities



Sources of Firearms Acquired by OC and Terrorists

• Domestic sources

- Leakage from factories/surplus stocks
- Loss of control over government stocks
- Theft
- Firearm conversion and re-activation
- International arms trade
 - Diversion from legal transfers
 - Interception of legal transfers



Common challenges in countering firearms trafficking

• Weak legislative and institutional frameworks

 - Specialised training courses
- Issue Papers
 - Firearms Protocol and the ATT
 - Comparative Analysis and synergies between global firearms and other conventional arms instruments
- Operational Tools
 - MLA Request Writer tool
 - Comprehensive record keeping system (new)
- Monitoring illicit arms flows
 - Illicit Arms Flows Questionnaire (new)
 - Template tool for front line officers for recording firearms seizure
