human rights measures, since their goal is to safeguard the rights to life and to personal security. , ffectively implementing the safe(haven aspects of relevant Security Council resolutions, including resolutions - . / . and -012, may thus be seen as a form of human rights measure. *f course, the Security Council, 3 eneral ssembly, and the ! uman %ights Council have stressed on many occasions that terrorism poses a serious threat to the en)oyment of human rights, and so steps must be taken to counter it.

Second, there is the 'uestion of the rights of victims of terrorism. 4 hile still unsettled, there is authority for the proposition that victims of grave international crimes have a right to)ustice. *ne reference in this respect is the 56asic "rinciples and 3 uidelines on the %ight to a %emedy and %eparation for 7 ictims of 3 ross 7 iolations of International ! uman %ights 8aw and Serious 7 iolations of International ! umanitarian 8aw,9 adopted by the 3 eneral ssembly in 1::;. 4 e should recall that the Special %apporteur of the ! uman %ights Council has concluded that acts of terrorism, even if committed by non(State actors, can 'ualify as human rights violations and, of course, certain acts of terrorism are also prohibited under I! 8. measures must themselves be carried out in compliance with human rights obligations. s we know, regrettably, this re'uirement is often disregarded. The goal of denying safe haven will only be advanced if States take further steps to ensure respect for human rights in the way in which they seek to strengthen international cooperation.
