On the basis of developing tradition maedia, the DPI fully leveraged the advantages of the technology of internet and increased publicity through the UN website and social mediæbuas the Facebook and twitter. These efforts made important headway the UN Radio and UNTV saw a growing number of partners arouthed world and expanded their reach through the internet. The UN account at Sinablog now has over 3.5 million followers, which enabled UN and at o get more attention and discussion in China. At the santiene, through greater communication and exchanges with people from allalks of life, the DPI promoted greater understanding and participation members of the public in UN affairs. The Chinese delegations would be to express its gratitude for DPI's efforts in the above-mentioned areas.

Madam Chairperson,

The Chinese delegation wishes to talkis opportunity to put forward the following suggests for further improving DPI's work.

First, develop the level of services in all working languages in a balanced manner. We express appreciation for DPI's effort of promoting UN activities in different languages. Atte same time, we have noted the gap in service levels and quality by working languages. Take the UN website for example, according to Betary-General's report, the page views of the Chinese, Arabic and languages combined account for only 13% of the total. Compare with the number of countries and people who use these languages, thouse programs in the Chinese language is relatively small, and there should be rhive ecoverage and webcasting in Chinese. We hope that the DPI will place emphasis on the balanced development of services all working languages, actively improve efficiency in using existing sources and enable or people in the world to conveniently and efficiting get UN information in their own languages.

Second, place importance on thespecial needs of developing countries for access to information. Recent years have seen some new measures on the part of the UN in utilizing new information and communications technologies such as inhiternet and social media. This has opened up new channels to proemitate UN to a larger audience. However, in many developing countries majority of people still rely on traditional media such as radio, and printed publications to acquire information. We hope that the DRVIII pay more attention to the gap between developing and voted oped countries in the area of information

and communications, provide more human resources and technological assistance to developing coules, and expand cooperation and exchanges with media developing countries.

Third, stay committed to providing accurate, impartial and objective information. Under the current circumstances, developing countries' voices are often ignored and muted dadack of effective means and channels of news reporting. The UN should advocate for the establishment of a more balanced fairer order in news communication and encourage the news media to observofessional ethics and provide objective and balanced information. And same time, we hope that the DPI will continue to provide time, accurate, impartial and full information to the outside world by variety of means and methods and set a good example for news media of all countries.
