- c. Data-Driven Decision-Making:

• Concrete Action: Conducing a thorough assessment to identify and address obstacles hindering sustainable development. Establish a task force to propose targeted solutions and monitor progress.

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# Chapter II. International peace and security

Recommendation Highlights:

Promoting and Maintaining International Peace and Security:

**Concrete Actions:** 

- i. Diplomacy and Conflict Prevention:
