Mr. Chairman,

I am pleased to extend you on behalf of the delegation of the UAE our congratulations on your election as Chairman of the 53rd session of the Commission on the Status of Women. I wish to thank you for your support and the members of your office during your tenure, appreciating your efforts in directing its work, and wishing you success in going forward. I also thank the Secretary General for his valuable reports on the items of the agenda.

My delegation wishes to associate itself with the statement given by the distinguished representative of Yemen on behalf of the Group of 77. We extend our heartfelt condolences to the Government and People of China for the losses they suffered due to the last disaster. The UAE will cooperate with the other countries to provide the needed assistance.

Mr. Chairman,

The UAE has translated its belief in the importance of mainstreaming a gender perspective in its plans for achieving the Millennium Development

Given the advanced nature of empowerment of women as one of its priorities, through integrating them in the further advancement of women and gender equality within the national programs for sustainable development in my country with the support of the provisions of the constitution and national laws that ensured the equality of citizens, men and women, in all fields and duties including the implementation of equal opportunities in all areas: education, work, health and social benefits. In addition to that, my country became a party to the international and regional treaties on women including CEDAW and Human Rights as well as a number of treaties on women's work and employment. Furthermore, we are committed to implement all the recommendations and outcomes of international conferences and summits on women with the integration of women advancement affairs and gender equality into all programs of development in the country, women issues gained political support on the highest level. The government has assigned seven national mechanisms to be directly concerned with women's and children's affairs and work on formulating women advancement strategies in accordance with the recommendations of Beijing and the 23rd special session of the GA.

The UAE has accomplished visible achievements in the promoting gender equality in all areas. In education, the percentage of girls enrolled in elementary schools is close to that of boys. In higher education, girls surpass boys comprising 77% of the total number of university graduates with constant increase in the number of women holding Masters and PhDs.

In the area of work and economic participation, the state has encouraged and supported women's entry in the work market, at the same time working on removing any obstacles in their way to work in any job they are capable of. Women now form 22.4% of total national work force; they occupy 66% in the private sector in which 30% are in leading and decision making positions including membership in the boards of the Chambers of Commerce and Industry. The establishment of the Business Women Council in the UAE was another step to promote and support women's contribution in the private sector.

As for advanced participation in decision making, the UAE has witnessed in recent years new developments in the public participation of women. We now have four women ministers in the cabinet, two of which are in charge of the Ministry of Justice and Social Affairs Portfolio. At the same time, women have been offered the opportunity to run for offices in the Federal

National Council and affiliated organizations comprising the total membership, which is a high percentage compared to women representation in many countries in the world....

In addition to women representation in the executive branch of state, women began participating in the judicial system through the designation of women, for the first time, as a judge and prosecutor, which is a demonstration of acknowledging the role of women in decision making.

Among the efforts made by the UAE to combat all forms of violence against women, the State has issued the Law on Combating Trafficking, which is considered the first in the region, with provisions covering all forms of trafficking and exploitation of women and children. It is backed up with a national plan of action, including criminalization, law implementation, victims support and international partnerships and cooperation.

The UAE continues its efforts to end discrimination culture equality and justice through state institutions, especially the judicial and medical, it continues working on removing social and psychological obstacles facing women's participation and total integration in all work sectors and their participation in decision making at all levels.

Mr. Chairman,

The UAE, while it expresses its solidarity and support to Palestinian women, who are living under tragic economic and humanitarian conditions due to the brutal aggressions committed by the occupying Israeli forces in Gaza, urges the international community to continue extending its support and assistance to the Palestinian people and their cities. In the Palestinian territories and the refugee camps, especially in areas such as education, health care, social care, employment and economic empowerment, taking into consideration a complete integration of a gender perspective in the international assistance programs for the Palestinian people. It is also necessary that the international community build intensive international pressure to put an end to the violence against the Palestinian women and expedite the process of reaching a just, peaceful and comprehensive permanent solution to the Palestinian problem.

Furthermore, we urge all involved parties to take into consideration the safety and protection of women and children during armed conflict, and to release those of them detained as hostages or prisoners; and to allow for the

relevant UN bodies to follow up on their situation and provide them with the necessary assistance.

In conclusion we urge for the continuation of the international efforts to enhance the political and financial support to assist millions of women in the developing and poor countries to improve their living conditions in accordance with the principles of the Charter of the United Nations, Human Rights, the Beijing Plan of Action and the special 22nd session of the General Assembly.
