Welcoming also the inclusion of a sub-item in the agenda of the Economic and Social Council entitled "Mainstreaming a gender perspective into all policies and programmes of the United Nations system", and the opportunity such inclusion provides to consider further measures to strengthen the implementation and monitoring of gender mainstr

and programmes of the entities of the United Nations, and of the role and effectiveness of existing institutional mechanisms;

4. Expresses its concern at the remaining constraints on the full implementation of gender mainstreaming into all policies and programmes of the United Nations system, including inadequate support for and follow-up of gender equality policies and strategies, poor utilization of gender analysis, inadequate monitoring mechanisms, and a number of ongoing critic

into all policies and programmes of the entities of the United Nations, as outlined in the report of the Secretary-General;

7. Requests the Secretary-General to include an assessment of the implementation of the present resolution in his report to the Commission at its forty-ninth session on the measures taken and progress achieved in the follow-up to and implementation of the Fourth World Conference on Women and the special session of the General Assembly entitled "Women 2000: gender equality, development and peace for the twenty-first century", especially in mainstreaming gender perspectives in entities of the United Nations system.
