Ms. Bintou Nimaga is a Technical Advisor on gendered women s economic empowerment at the Ministry of Women s and Children s Affairs in Mali. Thoughout her career, she has been involved with rural development, agriculture chanatural resource management. She has worked with various ministries, including Planning and Statistics Unit the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries, and th Ministry of Rural Development Environment. Ms. Nimaga has carried out various assignments with Ited Nations agencies and international nongovernmental organizations, dealing with pairintory approaches to local development and capacity strengthening of women s groups. She is member of the micro-finance committee of the Administrative Council of Soro Yiriwassond of the African Evalution Network (AFREA).

Mr. Andres Wehrle Rivarola is Vice-Minister of Agriculture, in the Ministry of Agriculture and Livestock of Paraguay. He is a founding membof the Centre for Education, Training and Rural Technology (CECTEC), a non-governmental ganization that has leveloped significant experience in youth education for both women anden in sustainable agrillural development. Mr. Wehrle Rivarola has authored several pirchtions on rural technologies, education and sustainable rural development. He is also the Nianal Coordinator of the pecialized Meeting on Family Farming of MERCOSUR (REAF/MERCOSUR), on behalf of Paraguay, and the Coordinator of the National Programme for the omotion of Family Agriculture for Food Production.

Mr. Victor Lutenco is Advisor in the Office of the PrimMinister of Moldova, where he covers the social and health sectors as well as supervisrelevant policy units on public administration reform and aid coordination. As part of a teach advisors, he is currently working on the implementation of a Government programme thans to change the development paradigms of the country: a one-widow model for information and swice provision. Mr. Lutenco has extensive experience in the social developmential, having previously worked for a non-governmental organization, for the Internatibiology anization for Migration, and for UNFPA, where he focused on population policies. He earden Master's degree in Political Science from the State University of Moldova.

Ms. Lilly Be'Soer is the founder of Voice for Change a non-governmental organization focusing on women s human rights that operates Papua New Guinea. She is also the General Secretary of a newly established regional network, the Hallands Regional Human Rights

Defenders Network, established with the support UNHCHR and UN Wmen. She collaborates with the Pacific network of wmen working to end violence against women, and with various rural women s groups focused on agriculturad markets.
